

Pizza Garden Plants



Planting/Caring for our Tomatoes, Basil, Peppers or Eggplant



1. You can start your seeds indoors in early April
2. Begin by mixing water with your soil until it has the moisture level of a wrung-out sponge
3. Fill your pot with the moistened soil
4. Use your finger to poke a 1/4" deep hole in the middle of the soil
5. Place 1-2 seeds into the hole
6. Cover the seed with soil and gently pat down the surface
7. Label and place your pots on a waterproof tray by a warm, sunny window (south-facing is always best!)
8. Check on your pots 1-2 times a day to make sure the soil is still moist (but not waterlogged)
9. Use a spray bottle or watering can to keep the soil moist, making sure it does not ever fully dry out
10. Monitor your pots and wait for the seed to germinate!
11. If more than one seed germinates in a single pot, you can keep one plant and pinch off the other one
12. As your plant grows, continue to water it whenever the soil starts to get dry
13. You can include some fertilizer once a week as soon as the plant starts to grow 3-4 leaves
14. If your plant starts to lean toward the sunlight, you can rotate it
15. Transplant the seedling into a bigger pot in a few weeks
16. The seedlings can be transferred outside and planted into the ground in mid-May
